CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR DENTAL HYGIENISTS/ASSISTANTS

NITROUS OXIDE ADMINISTRATION/MONITORING

Course Description Stephen Shall, DDS The dental hygienist is often the first member of the dental Western Lake Erie Oral & team to identify variations from normal during preventive Maxillofacial Surgeons appointments. Disorders and conditions will be discussed in terms of clinical features, referrals for biopsy, and management of each entity. Uncommon lesions that mimic common lesions will also be identified.

> Since 2000 Surgeon General's report on oral health, interest in oral health by the non-dental health professional as well as the public has increased steadily. The research and promotion of the links between oral disease and systemic health has further propelled oral health into the public arena. Updates will be provided on the efforts to improve oral health outcomes by Oral Health Ohio, the only statewide agency advancing this agenda for Ohio citizens.

The dental professional is in an excellent position to provide the extraoral examination as one portion of comprehensive patient treatment; however, this aspect of assessment is often overlooked. This course will identify normal anatomy, variants of normal and skin cancer.

Directions to Owens Community College for the September CE

From southbound I-75: Take I-75 South to Exit 198-Wales Road. Travel east on Wales Road and turn right onto Oregon Road (first intersection). You will turn RIGHT at the third traffic light which is First Street. At the first stop sign, turn left onto D Street. You will park in the parking lot to your left next to Heritage Hall.

From northbound I-75: Take I-75 North to Exit 198-Wales Road. Travel east on Wales Road and turn right onto Oregon Road (first intersection). You will turn RIGHT at the third traffic light which is First Street. At the first stop sign, turn left onto D Street. You will park in the parking lot to your left next to Heritage Hall.

From the Ohio Turnpike: Take the Ohio Turnpike to Exit 64, where it intersects with Interstate 75. Exit the turnpike heading north on I-75. Then follow the northbound I-75 directions above.

From State Route 20: Take SR 20 to Oregon Road, turn right. Go forward at the stop sign to the traffic light, turn LEFT onto First Street. At the first stop sign, turn left onto D Street. You will park in the parking lot to your left next to Heritage Hall.
